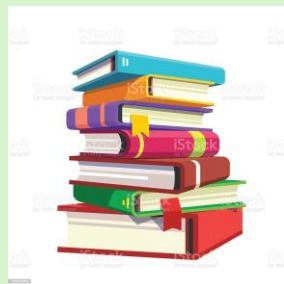
Congratulations to our President!
